Windows 98 Set-Up Instructions

1. Double Click My Computer. Double Click Control Panel
2. Double Click Internet
3. Click the Connections tab
4. Click Connect and select "I have an existing Internet account through my phone line, etc..."
5. Click Next, put a dot in "Select this option if you are accessing the Internet using an Internet service provider...etc...". Click Next.
6. Remove checkmark from "Use Area Code of Dialing Properties." Select "Connect using my phone line". Click Next
7. Type the phone number to connect to the Internet. Click Next
8. Click "No" on Advanced Settings. Click Next
9. Type in VTC for your Connection Name. Click Next
10. Select Yes on "Do you want to set up an Internet mail account". Click Next.
11. Select "Create a new Internet mail account". Click Next
12. Type in Your Display Name; (ex: John Doe). Click Next
13. Type in your Email address; (ex: johndoe@vtc.net). Click Next
14. Make sure it says My incoming mail server is a POP3 server.
15. In the Incoming mail box, type pop3.vtc.net
In the Outgoing mail box, type smtp.vtc.net. Click Next
16. Type your Login Name, account name, and your Password. Click Next
17. Type VTC for your Internet mail account name. Click Next
18. Select "No" for setting up Internet News account. If you want to set up a news account, select Yes. Click Next & use news.vtc.net for server name.
19. Select No for "Do you want to set up your Internet directory service account". Click Next.
20. Click Finish to complete configuration.

Windows 2000 Set-Up Instructions

1. Click the Start button
2. Click the Settings
3. Click the Network and Dialup Connections Bar.
4. Click "Make a New Connection". A Set-up wizard will appear. Click next to continue and make sure the "Dial Up to Internet" box is checked. Then click Next.
5. The Internet Connection Wizard will open. You will need to check the box that says, "I want to set up my Internet connection manually". Then click Next.
6. Check the box that says "I connect through my phone line and a modem." Then Click Next.
7. Remove check mark from "Use Area Code and Dialing Properties." Insert telephone number that was provided by Valley TeleCom. Then click next.
8. Type login name and password you selected when you filled out your Internet application. (Please note: type login name only; do not include "@vtc.net" then hit next.
9. Name your connection VTC and click Next.
10. You will be asked on this screen if you wish to set-up an Internet Mail Account Now. Select Yes and click Next. Select "Create a New Account". Click Next.
12. Type in your username. Hit Next.
13. Type your e-mail address (you@vtc.net) and hit next.
14. On this page you will need to ensure that your server is selected as a POP3. In the Incoming mail box, type pop3.vtc.net
In the Outgoing mail box, type smtp.vtc.net. Click Next.
15. The next screen will require your login name again (without the @vtc.net). If it is already listed , then type your password. Check the box that says remember password. Do not check the SPA box.
16. Click Finish. Your VTC Internet Connection is complete.

Macintosh OS 9 Set-Up Instructions

You will need your dial-up internet username and password

1. Close any applications running on your computer.
2. Click the Apple Icon and select "Control Panels".
3. Open "Remote Access".
4. Type in username and password in appropriate fields.
5. Type in your local VTC Internet access number into the Number Field.
6. Click the box on the upper left corner of the remote access window and save the configuration when prompted.
7. To connect to the internet, you need to perform the following actions:
 - close any running applications on your computer.
 - Click the Apple Icon and select "Control Panels".
 - Click "Remote Access".
 - Click "Connect".

Your Dial-Up connection is now configured.

Macintosh OS X Set-Up Instructions

You will need your dial-up internet username and password

1. Close any applications running on your computer.
2. Click the Apple Icon and select System Preferences.
3. In System Preferences, click Network.
4. From "Location" select Home.
5. Under Show, select internal modem.
6. On the TCP/IP tab set "Configure" to Using PPP. Do not enter info in the "Domain Name Servers" and "Search Domains" fields.
7. Click the "PPP" tab and enter in your VTC local dial-up access number.
8. Enter Username and Password in the appropriate fields.
9. Select the "Proxies" Tab.
10. Make sure that none of the tick boxes on the left hand side are selected.
11. Click "Apply" and save the settings.
12. To connect to the Internet, click the phone receiver icon near the system clock on the upper-right hand of your screen.
13. Click "Open Internet Connection".
14. Click Connect.
Your dial-up connection is now configured and should connect you to the internet. You can open your web browser and type in a website into the address bar. For example: www.vtc.net

Outlook Express 5 Set-Up Instructions

For an Apple computer.

1. Open Outlook Express.
2. Click on the Tools Menu, then click on Accounts.
3. In the Accounts window, select the New button.
4. Type your name in the Display Name Box provided, then select the right arrow on the lower right corner of the Accounts Window.
5. Select "I already have an e-mail address that I'd like to use", then type your e-mail address in the provided field. Then click the right arrow.
6. Make sure POP is in the drop-down box, then enter the following: pop3.vtc.net for the incoming mail server field and smtp.vtc.net for the outgoing mail server field. Then click the right arrow.
7. Your Account ID is the first part of your E-mail address and should be entered automatically. Enter your password in the field provided.
8. You can enter anything you want into the Account Name box, then click Finish.

Windows XP Set-Up Instructions

1. Click "Start" button. Click "Control Panel".
2. Double Click "Internet Options".
3. Click "Connections" tab.
4. Click "Set-up". Click "Next".
5. Select "Connect to the Internet". Click "Next".
6. Select "Set-up my connection manually". Click "Next".
7. Select "Connect using a dial-up modem". Click "Next".
8. Type in "VTC" for your ISP name. Click "Next".
9. Type in the telephone number, without the area code, for your service area. Click "Next".
10. Type in your username, password and confirm password. Click "Next".
11. Your Dialer is complete. Click Finish.

Setting Up E-mail in Outlook Express

1. Click the Start button. Click E-mail/Outlook Express.
2. Outlook Express will open. Click "Set-up a Mail Account".
3. Type in your username in the "Display Name" box and then click Next.
4. Type in your e-mail address (username@vtc.net). Click Next.
5. Make sure it says: My incoming mail server is POP3 server.
6. Type pop3.vtc.net for incoming mail, type smtp.vtc.net for outgoing mail. Click Next.
7. Your "Username" will appear in the "Account Name Box", type in your password, then click Next.
8. Click Finish.

Windows ME Set-Up Instructions

1. Double Click "My Computer", Double Click "Control Panel".
2. Double Click "Internet Options".
3. Click on Connections tab
4. Click Setup, select "I want to set up my internet connection manually".
5. Click Next, select "I connect through a phone line and modem". Click Next.
6. Type your area's Valley Telecom connection number, (Area code and Phone number). Click Next
7. Type in your User Name and Password, Click Next
8. Type in Connection Name, (will have default name). Change to VTC. Click Next
9. It will ask if you want to setup your Email account. Choose Yes. Click Next
10. Select "Create New Internet Mail" account. Click Next.
11. Type in Your Name. Click Next
12. Type in your Email address. Click Next
13. Make sure it says: "My incoming mail server is a POP3 Server"
14. In the Incoming mail box, type pop3.vtc.net
In the Outgoing mail box, type smtp.vtc.net. Click Next
15. Type in your Account Name and Password. Click Next.
16. Click Finish and connect to the Internet.
